
Workshop Description

In this unique workshop '*Contemporary Botanical Art: Bigger is Better*' you will be taking a small subject/photo and learning how to grid it to create a large painting.

Using your own subject, you will learn new techniques and be able to use some artistic license to choose the size and format of your finished painting, while retaining the integrity of botanical art.

Working with the standard watercolour processes of washes and colour studies and the more complex process of glazing and dry brushing, this workshop offers an ideal opportunity to explore another dimension of botanical art and to observe and explore composition, colour, form, texture, light and tone. I take this one step further to show you how to create a contemporary botanical painting.

You will only be limited by your imagination of subject, size and representation. Through demonstrations and individual tuition, the process of enlarging and/or cropping your subject will be demystified and simplified. You will learn valuable strategies resulting in successful outcomes.
